In the 1800s, there was a minister who was going two miles into a neighborhood where very few could read, to spend an evening in reading to a company who were assembled to listen. He said, "I was about to return by a narrow path through the woods where paths diverged, and I was provided with a torch of light wood, or "pitch pine." I objected; it was too small, weighing not over half a pound. "It will light you home," answered my host. I said, "The wind may blow it out." He said, "It will light you home." "But if it should rain?" I again objected. "It will light you home," he insisted.

Contrary to my fears, it gave abundant light to my path all the way home, furnishing an apt illustration. I often think of the way in which doubting hearts would be led safely along the "narrow way." If they would take the Bible as their guide, it would be a lamp to their feet, leading to the heavenly home. A man told me one day that he had 2 objections with the Bible. I answered him in the words of my good friend who furnished the torch, "It will light you home." - from the American Messenger - 1881.
