Treasuring His Word... From the Pastor's heart:

What do you do in times of trouble? When fears, uncertainties, insecurities, and pending dangers bombard your life, is there any way to find hope? YES! Let me encourage you to remember what I shared on Sunday: **<u>Call</u>** upon the Lord, <u>**Trust**</u> in the Lord, and <u>**Wait**</u> upon the Lord!

1. Call upon the Lord

"Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I shall rescue you, and you will honor Me" (Psalm 50:15). "Whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Romans 10:13).

2. Trust in the Lord

"Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6). "Commit your way to the LORD, trust also in Him, and He will do it" (Psalm 37:5).

3. Wait upon the Lord

"Indeed, none of those who wait for Thee will be ashamed" (Psalm 25:3a). "The LORD is good to those who wait for Him, to the person who seeks Him. It is good that he waits silently for the salvation of the LORD" (Lamentations 3:25-26).
